The UP-DRAFT Carburetor

Common on older farm & industrial equipment, but an engineering error...



In 1896 German engine designer and automotive pioneer Wilhelm Maybach partnered with engineer-industrialist Gottlieb Daimler and created the float-type spray carburetor...the precursor of what would become the modern carburetor. This carburetor was of the up-draft design, due to the flawed and mistaken reasoning that gasoline fumes and vapors rise...gasoline fumes and vapors actually settle downward!

Gasoline fumes and vapors are very volatile when changing from their liquid state and are "heavier" than air and will sink and collect at the lowest level they can find...on an up-draft carburetor they will exit the carburetor thru the intake. Also the up-draft design is less efficient than its later cousins, the down-draft and side-draft carburetors. Not only is the air flow of the up-draft "counter" to the Inherent flow of the fuel's fume and vapor, but it is problematic at the start-up of older engines that have lost compression and the "ability" to create a quick & substantial vacuum. The intake manifold of the up-draft equipped engine is pre-loaded with "air", while the intake of the down-draft and side-draft equipped engine is full of gaseous fumes...which are immediately pulled into the cylinders at the first crank, ready to meet the spark plug.

Pluses of the up-draft design are that it allows for a lower engine profile, can better use a gravity-feed fuel supply, and will never flood the engine. These were the reasons generally given for using this design, but are actually after-the-fact benefits for what was essentially an engineering error.
