

# The 100th Birthday of the PORTABLE POWER DRILL!

This year marks the 100th anniversary of the Portable Power Drill's invention. In 1910, S. Duncan Black and Alonzo G. Decker opened a small machine shop in Baltimore Maryland. Among their clients was the COLT MANUFACTURING CO. of rifle and pistol fame. Electric drills were already in operation, but were large and stationary (think drill press) and were in use in heavy industrial, marine and manufacturing operations.

In 1916 BLACK & DECKER filed a patent application for a 1/2" portable power drill that one person could hold and operate. It had a universal electric motor and could run on both AC and DC (which was still popular in the early days of the 20th century...thank you Thomas Edison). Duncan and Alonzo were considering the design of the electric drill they were developing and trying to work out how the user could best hold the tool and control the drilling process. Nearby was a COLT handgun with its conventional pistol grip and trigger arrangement...problem solved! The light weight portable power drill was born.



These early drills were intended for industrial use, were aimed at professionals and were expensive. When B&D plant supervisors noticed employees taking the power drill home to use on home-projects, they recognized the do-it-yourself market potential of the new tool. By 1921 B&D had a full page ad running in the *Saturday Evening Post*, already a major magazine of the period, directed at a national consumer market...and by 1923 they were targeting "nonprofessionals" with a low-priced portable power drill.

In 2010, Black & Decker merged with Stanley Works to become STANLEY BLACK & DECKER.

*The original portable drill, assembled in 1916, is at the National Museum of American History in Washington D.C.*
