

The June 4, 2024 club meeting was held at the Fairgrounds Club shed.

President, Chuck Klim, called the meeting to order, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

The May 7th club meeting minutes were read by secretary, Sandy Betts.

Treasurer, Linda Klim reported the general account balance was \$4,402.23 and raffle account balance was not available.

To sell peanuts in the shed we need to have a house certificate and permit and a vendors permit which Linda applied for. We also need a food handlers' card which she renewed last month and now is good for three more years. The raffles require licenses which are \$20.00 each and \$40.00 for the Town of Frankford.

Linda brought up business cards for the Club...she can get a good deal on 250 cards and feels we should have some made-up.

At next month's meeting we will vote on By-Law revisions.

The hats are 80% finished and paid for, we still waiting for the 45 embroidered hats. Upcoming expenses are for propane and 27 bags of peanuts. They usually cost around \$1,300.00. Linda also would like to buy a mat stating "Working Members Only" to cushion standing time and deter non-members from going behind the display cabinets. She found one for about \$16.00.

The second wagon needs to be painted. We had a discussion on the color of paint. New Holland colors were decided upon.

Club work day will be Saturday starting at 9:00. Stone is possibly being delivered by Jack Snook. Brian Kordos will have his machine there and a dump trailer will also be made available. A mat or filter fabric is needed to control weeds.

Chuck asked members to stay after the meeting to try and get the peanut machine running to make sure that it works before we take it up to Montague on June 29^{th.} Events will be held at the Montague Town Hall and start at 4:00 PM. Jim LeDonne asked Club members to bring their tractors and the carts up for display and to run. He offered his trailer for use giving rides. A permit to transport propane, for the peanut machine, must be obtained.

Chuck spoke about electrical work to be done in the shed and the need to get a permit and licensed electrician. Chuck might be able to get Paul Katterman from High Point Electric to do the work.

Chuck brought Mike Insinga of High Point Welding & Diesel over to look at the Oil City/South Penn engine. He can weld the crack but cannot guarantee it because cast iron is tricky. But if it does leak a little bit, we could use a little JB Weld. It would cost approximately \$300.00 to fill with antifreeze but that would save future damage from happening.

Also discussed was the Fairbanks engine for the line shaft, which needs governor work and a few other repairs.

Sparta July 4th parade was discussed and also the problems encountered last year . The Club will participate in the parade, but someone is needed to take photos.

Brian Kardos motioned the meeting to be adjourned and Steve Boutillette seconded.
