

Kevin then read off the account balances in both the General account and the Raffle account. There was no change in the balance of the Raffle Account and there were three deposits made to the General Account...one of which was \$200 received from Steve Boutilette for the purchase of a small engine from the club and 2 new memberships.

New Business: Chuck mentioned this year our Christmas Party will be on <u>December 15th a Wednesday</u>, as the weekends are booked for the winter months.

We then held an election for the open Vice President position, which has been covered by Blace Flatt and Rich Muys Sr. as temps, since Paul Havens passed earlier this year. Voting ballots were handed out to all the members present and Brian Kardos was nominated and elected our new Vice President with the majority of the votes.

Fair News: This year we purchased 9 sweatshirts to see how they would sell at the fair and a question was put out to all members on how much to charge as we paid \$26 for each. Members agreed to sell them for \$35 dollars. Mary did take orders at our last meeting in July for anyone who would like to order a sweatshirt for themselves. The zipper hooded sweatshirts are \$31 and the pull-over sweatshirts are \$26 to members. Another order will be taken at the next meeting. We purchased a lot more brooms, both medium and small handle and the members were asked how much to charge for these. It was agreed to sell the large and medium brooms for \$15 and to sell the child's broom for \$12. NOTE: A lot were sold during fair week!

The raffles will include the American Girl doll, John Deere tractor and the handmade quilt, with the drawing going off on Saturday...the last day of the Fair.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Rich Muys and Andy Mackey 2nd the motion.




